You will then record the trail of links you took in order to find the information. Most items will be no more than three links deep into any specific website. Google is the only site listed that is not to be used in this search, as it is a search tool rather than a source. Any of the other links are fair game. Don't spend too much time at any particular site, as you will quickly run out of time.
